What is Friendship Tutoring?

Friendship Tutoring is a tuition-free project of the Outreach and Service Ministry Team of Faith UCC. The purpose of the program is to help children succeed in elementary school.

Tutors work one-on-one with children to help them complete homework assignments, teacher suggested activities and to improve reading, writing, math and computer skills.

Who are the Tutors?

Penn State students, most of whom are education majors, volunteer to tutor the children.



Who is Eligible?

The Friendship Tutoring Program is for children in kindergarten through sixth grade. Children are referred by Park Forest Day Nursery, Head Start, and the State College Area School District. Children not referred will be considered on a space-available basis.



How Does the Program Work?

- Tutors train in a workshop
- Children's school teachers suggest work activities
- Tutors work with children
- Children keep activity journals
- Director reviews journals and recommends further activities

What do Children Gain?

Each child gains an appreciation for learning through one-on-one interaction with an adult learner, their tutor, in a rich learning environment. Activities are secular. For good attendance, children may select books to keep and receive a newsletter to build pride in their accomplishment.
